

Below is a travel guide to help you plan your trip to WA2025 in Qingdao, China, with essential information on travel logistics, accommodation, and other important details.

Travel Information for Attending WA2025 China in Qingdao, China

1. Event Program

- Event: WA2025 China (World Aquaculture China 2025)
- Event Date: April 24 to 27, 2024
- Venue: Qingdao International Convention and Exhibition Center, Qingdao, China
 Located in the political and commercial center of Laoshan District
- Address: No. 9 Miaoling Road, Laoshan District, Qingdao, China
- Website: http://qingdao.qdicec.com.cn/. (You can translate the website into your preferred language when you visit.)
- The venue is about a 40-minute drive from the Qingdao Airport.
- Exhibition Location: Hall 2
- Conference & Registration Location: Hall 5

2. Event Registration

- Please register online at https://was.org/meeting/code/WA2025
- For Chinese participants, a brochure and exhibit invitation are available in your language on the website. You can also register online directly on the same site. Additionally, if you use a translation app, you can select to translate the website during registration, and it will automatically switch to your preferred language.
- Please be reminded that the Early Bird discount registration closed on April 1st, 2025.
 However, late registrations are still being accepted but will not include the discounted price
- Abstract Submission deadline is January 31, 2025

On the event date:

- If you have already registered and paid online in advance, when your arrival, you can pick up your badges at the **ADVANCE REGISTRATION DESK**.
- For those who are unable to make payment online, ON-SITE payment will be accepted. However, we highly recommend registering in advance to avoid long queues.

3. Travel to Qingdao

Qingdao is a major coastal city located in Shandong Province on China's eastern coast.

1.By Air:

- Qingdao JiaoDong International Airport (TAO) is the primary airport serving the city, approximately 40 minutes from downtown Qingdao and Venue. See more at https://www.qdairport.com/cms
 - International Flights: Qingdao has direct international flights from several major cities around the world, including Beijing, Shanghai, Hong Kong, Seoul, Tokyo, and other East Asian cities.
 - Domestic Flights: There are also direct flights from major cities in China, such as Beijing, Shanghai, Guangzhou, Chengdu, and Xi'an.
 - Airlines operating to/from Qingdao:
 Air China, China Eastern, China Southern, and several international carriers.

2. By Train:

- High-speed trains (CRH trains) run frequently between Qingdao and cities like Beijing,
 Shanghai, Jinan, and Tianjin.
- Qingdao Railway Station and Qingdao North Railway Station are the two main train stations in the city.
 - Qingdao Railway Station is more central, while Qingdao North Railway Station is used for high-speed trains traveling to and from other major cities.

4. Visa and Travel Documents

- As a foreign visitor to China, it is your responsibility to secure a visa for travel to China if required, unless you are from a visa-exempt country. To determine whether you need a visa and whether your country qualifies for a visa exemption, please check the link at https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Visa policy of mainland China.
- Visa Application: Visit the Chinese Embassy or Consulate in your country to apply for a visa. The process may take a few days or weeks, so make sure to apply in advance.
- To assist with your visa application, we will provide an invitation letter. Please make sure to request it well in advance, and ensure you have completed your registration. Additionally, kindly provide your passport details as follows when making the request.

5. WA2025 Conference Mobile App: (Please Refresh the app Upon Arrival to get the latest event updates)

- Download the Official Event App: Install the "WAS Meeting Assistant" application, available on both Google Play and the Apple App Store. Once downloaded, the app will display the WAS Event program that have been scheduled those time when you downloaded.
- Or scan the QR code provided below. This will direct you to the event page, where you
 can see the current event. Please note that the current event program will typically
 appear one or two weeks before the scheduled date, so be sure to refresh the app if
 you have it installed already.

6. Alipay and WeChat in China for Foreigner

• While credit cards are widely accepted in many areas of China, particularly in larger cities and tourist spots, mobile payment apps such as WeChat Pay and Alipay have become the dominant method for financial transactions. These apps are used extensively for everyday purchases, making them essential tools for navigating the local economy. Although credit cards are still accepted in internationally recognized venues, travelers should consider setting up a mobile payment account or having a backup of local currency, especially when traveling outside major cities.

- Both Alipay and WeChat Pay have transformed the way people in China manage money, pay for goods and services, and even socialize. Their popularity highlights the shift towards a cashless society, with mobile payments playing a central role in the digital economy. Furthermore, their influence is no longer confined to China; both apps are expanding into global markets, demonstrating the growing importance of mobile payments worldwide.
- Alipay is a standalone app focused primarily on financial services and payments, whereas WeChat Pay is integrated within WeChat, a multifunctional app that also offers messaging, social networking, and entertainment features.
- As a foreigner in China, using these apps can significantly enhance your travel experience by making transactions quicker and more convenient. Setting up either WeChat Pay or Alipay is easy, and you can link them to an international bank card without needing a Chinese bank account. With mobile payments in hand, you'll find it much easier to explore and enjoy your time in China.



7. Airport Transfer and Transportation Within Qingdao

Qingdao has a reliable and efficient transportation system for getting around the city.

Travel from the airport:

- <u>Taxi:</u> A taxi ride from Qingdao Jiaodong Airport to downtown takes around 30-40 minutes.
- The Qingdao Jiaodong Airport Taxi Station is located outside Gate 3 on the L1 floor of the terminal building. To take a taxi, please follow the airport signs and queue up at the station.

- Taxis and Ride-hailing: Didi (China's equivalent of Uber) is widely used in Qingdao. You can easily book a taxi through the Didi app. Search "Didi" in your Alipay or WeChat APP, then choose your location and your destination, choose your preferred type of car. The fee will be paid via your Alipay or WeChat account after you get off from the taxi.
- Taxis in Qingdao are relatively affordable, and some driver can speak English however, be sure to have your destination written in Chinese for the driver. This will help ensure smooth communication.
- <u>Airport Shuttle</u>: There are several shuttle bus routes available that connect the airport to different parts of the city.

• <u>Metro</u>: Qingdao has a **Metro Line 1** that connects the airport to downtown Qingdao. It's a fast and affordable option.

6. Top Attractions in Qingdao

Some of the most popular place in Qingdao around the Convention Center include:

Shilaoren Beach:

• Located at the southern end of Haier Road in Laoshan District, to the east of Datang Fishery Banquet, Shilaoren Beach is one of the largest bathing beaches in Qingdao. Stretching over a total length of 3 kilometers, it offers ample space for visitors to enjoy the scenic beauty and coastal activities. At the left end of the beach, a prominent rock formation in the sea is known as "Shilaoren," after which the beach is named. The area has evolved into a comprehensive tourist resort, offering a wide range of activities such as vacationing, sightseeing, marine sports, beach sports, and leisure entertainment.

May Fourth Square:

• It is located in the Eastern New District, with the Qingdao Municipal Government Office Building to the north and Fushan Bay to the south. It is named to commemorate Qingdao as the fuse of the "May Fourth Movement".

Polar Ocean World:

Located on Qingdao Donghai East Road, south of Shilaoren Tourist Resort, it stretches from the Sculpture Park in the east to the Ocean Entertainment City in the west, with green mountains behind and the sea on three sides. It is a large-scale open tourism project with the theme of Ocean Park, integrating food, accommodation, transportation, travel, shopping and entertainment, invested and built on the basis of the original Qingdao Dolphin Performance Hall. It is currently the largest venue in China with the most complete and largest number of polar marine animals.

Qingdao Beer Museum (Tsingtao Brewery):

• Discover the history of China's famous Tsingtao beer. Qingdao Beer Museum, which lies on the old site of the Tsingtao Brewery Company, which is a world-famous manufacturing enterprise special in brewing.

Zhanqiao Pier:

• A scenic pier offering views of the city and the Yellow Sea and the symbol of Qingdao, was built in 1891, covering a distance of 440 meters. Bathed in the sunlight, Huilange Pavilion, a two-storied octagonal pavilion at the south end of the pier, is radiant with golden light like a shining pearl floating on the sea held by a jade arm.

Badaguan Scenic Area:

• is located in the southern district of Qingdao, Shandong Province, and is considered the most iconic scenic spot in the city. Known for its picturesque combination of red-

tiled roofs, lush greenery, deep blue sea, and clear skies, it captivates visitors with its natural beauty. The area gets its name, "Badaguan," meaning "Eight Passes," due to the original eight roads (now expanded to ten), each named after famous historical passes in China. Prior to the liberation, Badaguan was a prestigious villa district, primarily inhabited by government officials and capitalists.

9. Currency and Payment

The official currency of China is the **Chinese Yuan (CNY)**. It's advisable to exchange your home currency for Chinese Yuan before you arrive or at the airport, although international currency exchange services are available at the airport and in the city center.

- **Credit Cards**: Major international credit cards like **Visa**, **MasterCard**, and **American Express** are accepted in most hotels, international restaurants, and high-end shops.
- Mobile Payments: Mobile payment apps like WeChat Pay and Alipay are widely used in China.

10. Language

- **Mandarin** is the official language spoken in Qingdao. While many people in the tourist industries may speak some English.
- Translation Apps: Download a translation app like Google Translate or Pleco to help with communication, especially when ordering food, asking for directions, or travelling.

11. General Tips

- Weather: In April fully embraces the warming trends of spring.
- Electronics: China uses 220V, 50Hz electrical power, and the plug type is Type A, C, and I.
- Travel Adapters: Make sure to bring plug adapters for your devices.
- SIM Cards: You can buy a local SIM card at the airport or in the city for data and calling purposes. Providers like China Mobile, China Unicom, and China Telecom offer SIM cards for tourists.
- **Safety**: Qingdao is a relatively safe city. However, as with any large city, be cautious of pickpockets in crowded places.
