This year's WAS-AC HONORS AND AWARDS recipients were celebrated during the Opening Ceremony of the World Aquaculture Safari 2025 (WA25) in Uganda, which attracted over 1,800 participants from 79 countries. #### WAS-AFRICA HONORARY AWARD 2025

The award is conferred upon an identified individual who has made a longstanding and significant contribution in the establishment and support to the Chapter's operations

Dr. John Walakira (UGANDA)- WAS-AC Immediate Past President and leader in development of the Chapter; and for significant contributions to aquaculture development in Africa.

Dr. Nelly Isyagi (UGANDA) – One of the longest serving members of the WAS AC (since 1990s); Leader in launching and establishing the Chapter; and beings its First Eastern Africa Regional Director; Renowned for continental work on developing and advancing aquatic animal health networks in Africa, through the African Union.
